### COUNTABLE AND UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

## Countable nouns (brojive imenice) have a singular and plural form (imaju i jedninu i množinu!)

We can count them – možemo da ih izbrojimo, brojive su i da koristimo glagole za jedninu i množinu.

- A tree two trees (dva drveta) This tree is old.
- A **book** three book**s** (tri knjige) The books **are** old. Do you want to buy some books?
- There are some great **shops**. Shop shops
- Look at some computer games. Game games
- Buy a birthday card. Card cards
- Have a **drink**. Drink drinks
- Hand out with your **friends**.
- Shopping malls are popular. Mall malls
- There are some **plants**. Plant plants
- There are some department stores and cinemas.

## **Uncountable nouns (nebrojive imenice)** have only <u>one form</u> – <u>no plural!</u> (imaju samo jedan oblik u jednini, **nemaju množinu**!)

We always use <u>a singular verb</u> (glagol za jedninu). We <u>cannot use articles</u> (a, an) <u>or a number</u> before them! (ne koristimo članove ni brojeve ispred nebrojivih imenica). Uncountable nouns are often:

- Abstract ideas: love, freedom, education, luck, help, beauty, music, thunder...
- Made of smaller parts: sugar, rice, salt, sand, flour, dirt, dust, traffic, grass, spaghetti
- Some food (cut into small parts): bread, fish, cheese, chocolate, meat, bacon, food, ham...
- Liquids /gases: water, milk, wine, oil, coffee, rain, soup, shampoo, air, smoke, blood, juice, fog...
- Materials: wood, glass, paper, gold, silver, ice, iron, cotton, wool, steel
- **Uncountable in English**: furniture, advice, work, news, information, luggage, money, homework (plural: pieces of advice, pieces of furniture, pieces of information, how much money?...)

### Uncountable nouns, examples:

- **Sugar** is sweet. Is **rice** healthy?
- He doesn't eat bread.
- There isn't any **traffic**.
- I have one more **piece of homework** to do. (one essay or exercise that you have to do)

Articles: A, AN / Quantifiers: SOME/ANY

# <u>Singular countable</u> nouns: use **a/an**: Brojive imenice u <u>jednini</u> – koristimo neodređene članove

- There is a bottle on the table. There is an apple on the table.
- I want a new computer.
- I haven't got a pen. (član A jer je jednina brojive imenice. Da je množina pisalo bi: I haven't got any pens.)
- You can buy a birthday card.
- Have you got a DVD player? (član A jer je jednina brojive imenice. Da je množina imenice, stajalo bi u pitanju: Have you got any DVD players?
- They've got a new computer game in the shop!

# <u>Plural countable</u> nouns and <u>uncountable</u> nouns (use some/any): Za <u>brojive imenice u</u> <u>množini</u> i za <u>nebrojive imenice</u>:

**Affirmative** – use **SOME**: Koristimo SOME kod potvrdnih rečenica:

- There is **some cheese** in the fridge. (some + uncountable nouns)
- There are **some great shops**. (some + plural countable noun)
- There are **some delicious sweets** in this shop. (some + plural countable noun)
- She has got **some designer** T-**shirts**. (some + plural countable noun)
- I have got **some magazines**. (some + plural countable noun)
- There are some great new CDs this week. (some + plural countable nouns)
- There is **some great music** on this CD. (some + uncountable noun)
- It is **some good news.** I have **some news** to tell you. (some + uncountable noun)

**Negative** – use **ANY**: Koristimo ANY kod negativnih rečenica:

- There isn't **any cheese** in the fridge. (any + uncountable noun)
- There isn't **any traffic**. (any + uncountable)

- There aren't **any oranges** at the greengrocer's today. (any + plural countable noun)
- There isn't any sugar in my coffee. (any + uncountable noun)
- There aren't any parks. (any + plural countable noun)

**Questions** – use **ANY**: Koristimo ANY kod upitnih rečenica:

- Is there **any cheese** in the fridge? (any + uncountable noun)
- Is there **any water** in that bottle? (any + uncountable noun)
- Have you got any shampoo? (any + uncountable noun)
- Are there **any cafes** in this shopping mall? (any + plural countable noun)
- Are there any sweets in your shopping basket? Yes, there are. (any + plural countable noun)

An increase in traffic is a small price to pay for the convenience of a new shopping mall in our neighbourhood. 3

#### Da sumiramo:

Kod BROJIVIH imenica (countable) koristimo

- članove a/an, kad su imenice u jednini (an apple)
- brojeve (three books)
- koristimo SOME (pozitivne rečenice, samo uz množinu brojive imenice)
- koristimo ANY (negativne i upitne rečenice, samo uz množinu brojive imenice)

Kod NEBROJIVIH (uncountable) imenica –nemaju oblik u množini!

- ne koristimo članove ni brojeve (sugar)
- Koristimo SOME (pozitivne rečenice We have some good news.)
- Koristimo ANY(negativne i upitne rečenice We do not have any shampoo.)
